

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
COURSE DESCRIPTION

This Kawaida Master Class in Maatian Ethics will be taught by Master Teacher and Seba Ma'at, Dr. Maulana Karenga. An ethical philosopher and author of *Kawaida* philosophy, he has developed for over three decades a creative and scholarly *Kawaida* interpretation of ancient Egyptian Maatian ethical thought as a living tradition and a useful philosophical option to engage the urgent issues of our time. *Kawaida* philosophy is an ongoing synthesis of the best of African sensitivities, thought and practice in constant exchange with the world.

The class will explore the ethical thought of ancient Egypt (*Kemet*) with due attention to the socio-historical context in which it was developed and evolved and to its major concepts, concerns and insights rooted in and guided by the moral ideal of *Ma'at* (rightfulness and goodness in the world).







This will include a critical examination of central themes of the major ethical texts of ancient Egypt as collected in the *Husia*, including:

- (1) the Sebait (The Moral Instructions);
- (2) the *Ikeru* (The Declarations of Virtues);
- (3) the Four Good Deeds of Ra in the Book of Vindication;
- (4) the Book of Khunanpu;
- (5) the Book of Djedi;
- (6) the Declarations of Innocence in the Pert-em-Heru

 (The Book of Coming Forth By Day); and
- (7) the Instructions to the Prime Minister.

The course will also demonstrate how this rich, ancient and ongoing ethical tradition can serve as an African-centered foundational source to engage and address critical issues of our times such as: human dignity, human rights, human relations, male/female relations, right relations with the environment, reparations, war and peace, immigration, poverty, racial and social justice, the good life, education, the ethics of struggle, and serudj ta, the moral obligation to constantly heal, repair, renew and remake ourselves and the world in the interest of African and human good and the well-being of the world and all in it.

- 4. Exercise an enhanced ability to engage in moral deliberation and critical thinking about moral concepts and issues from an African-centered standpoint:
