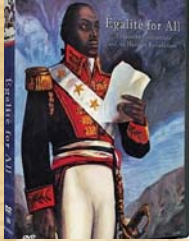

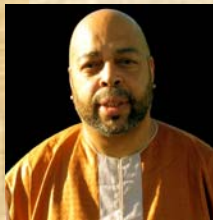

“Egalite for All: Toussaint Louverture and the Haitian Revolution” (Film and Discussion)

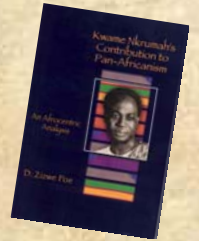


A narrative of the heroic world-impacting Haitian Revolution (1791-1804) waged and won by enslaved Africans who rose up against their enslavers, defeated four armies and established the first Black Republic in the world and the second Republic in the Western Hemisphere. It is the only successful revolt and revolution by enslaved persons and served as an inspiration and example to the oppressed and a warning to the oppressor.

Kwame Nkrumah’s Contribution to Pan-Africanism: An Afrocentric Analysis (Book Party and Reception)



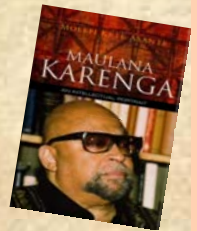
