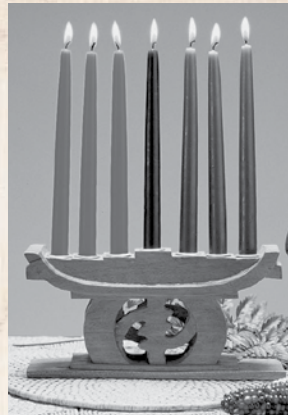
To carry out this task, the Center offers a wide range of cultural and educational programs and activities for all ages. Among these are:

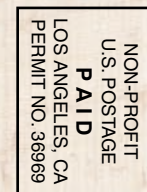
